Program of Activities Reports

Hallie - Participation Points

Participation points this year will be the same as previous years. You will need 5 points to participate at the county stock show and 3 points to participate for major shows. You can earn points by participating in community service projects, attending FFA meetings, competing in contests and other special events throughout the year. Uvalde County Junior Livestock Show requires exhibitors to attend a minimum of 3 FFA meetings to be eligible to show. Make sure that you sign into each meeting you attend in order to get credit. FFA members are also eligible to receive participation points towards their letterman jackets. District contests are 1 point, this includes county stock show, and 1/2 a point for events above the district level.

Utopia FFA was blessed to be able to host the Revaldina District Greenhand Camp once again this year! We welcomed over 125 first year FFA members, including 14 of our own, on September 14th to join us for an evening of activities. Members completed 4 rotations of workshops focused on leadership development, participated in a recycling drive community service project, and made new friends from over 10 other schools! Our officer team helped serve food and the district officers with their rotations.

Cooper - UCJLS Updates

The Uvalde County Junior Livestock Show will be held January 26-28th, 2023 at the Uvalde County Fairplex. All exhibitors wanting to show under Utopia FFA will need to be a paid FFA member and meet the participation points to be eligible. All livestock entries must be completed online through the ucjls.org website. Exhibitors must sign up for a concession stand time slot as well on the ucjls.org website. These items must prior to your species validation date! Proof of concession stand sign up must be printed and brought to validation. It is imperative that all exhibitors have a copy of the most updated rule book and know your validation dates and species rules. A copy of the rules can be found on the ucjls.org website or the Utopia FFA website. The dates for the upcoming validations and entry deadlines are as follows:

- Commercial Heifers: September 25th
- Market Lambs, breeding sheep and meat goats: October 29th
- Swine: November 12th
- Horses: December 5th
- Poultry: December 10th (pickup date)
- Rabbits: January 5th

Poultry orders and entries are due by November 1st, NO EXCEPTIONS. The deadline for entries for farm projects, baked foods, homemade salsa, and photography is December 1st.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to get your animals validated and entry fees paid by the correct date! We are currently working with the livestock board, extension agent and species superintendents to setup a new date for Utopia market lambs, breeding sheep and meat goats due to conflict with our Fall Festival. As soon as we have a date, we will let everyone know.

Chloe C - LDE Contest Dates

LDE, or Leadership Development Events, are in full swing! We have begun practices and are getting ready for the district contest! Contest dates can be found on the Utopia FFA website. It is important that members who are on a team keep their parents in the loop about contest dates. Any conflicts need to be addressed with the ag teachers ASAP. Failure to attend contests without prior notice could result in the removal from a team. The contest dates are as follows:

All team members need to make sure they are attending their respective team practices majority of the time. Failure to attend practices could result in removal from team.
